Newsletter #8 will focus on: Claiming for WGOS using the old GOS paperwork




Rome was not built in a day. New WGOS forms will be introduced in due course, but until then we are using the old GOS forms with annotations. Our colleagues in the Payments Team have asked us to remind the profession of the following points.



WGOS 1 claims for patients "at risk"

Please use a GOS1W to claim for a WGOS 1 on the grounds of "risk" and annotate the form as below. It is no longer appropriate to use a WECS1 form to make a claim for patients with this eligibility.




Child non-stock lens supplement


Can be claimed on both GOS3 and GOS4 forms. Please annotate the back of the forms as below. Note this supplement can be claimed for single vision lenses only. When claiming for a repair using a GOS4W, if only one lens is replaced, only ½ the supplement may be claimed.

If a 'child Non-stock Lens Supplement' is being claimed, please cross out the word 'complex' and replace with 'CNSL'.

Note: The supplement can only be claimed if there is evidence to demonstrate that the patient has recieved a lens that improves the cosmetic appearance e.g., surfaced lenses, smaller blank sizes, higher index lenses etc.



- If the patient is eligible solely due to their ethnicity, please:
 - » Annotate the form with 'at risk of developing eye disease due to my ethnicity' and;
 - » Document the patient's ethnicity on the form in the GP/ Local Authority/ Hospital box.



If a Special Facial Characteristics Supplement is being claimed, please cross out the words 'Small glasses' and replace with 'SFC'.

Note: The records must evident why this supplement is being claimed as well as demonstrating that a special spectacle frame has been manufactured specifically for the patient.

GOS3W Vouchers


The voucher value is dictated by the date of issue not the date of use. For a voucher issued prior to 20th October the previous voucher value should be claimed.

WGOS2 in a mobile setting

Please annotate the WECS 1 form with the reason the patient has received a mobile service and indicate if this was the first, second or subsequent person seen at this address.

- If the WGOS 2 took place outside of a NWSSP approved practice, the reason for requiring a mobile service must be documented on the claim form as well as on the record.
- If the WGOS 2 took place outside of a NWSSP approved practice, in order to be paid the correct fee, please annotate the form with the words

"I claim the Mobile fee for [insert whether it's the first, second or subsequent] patient at the address"



Mobile Services and CVI


Where CVI is performed in a mobile setting, the mobile service fee should be claimed using the CVI claim form. Where WGOS 1 and a CVI are delivered together in a mobile setting, please claim the mobile service element on the GOS6W form.

CVI/IP Services

Please use the service claim forms to request payment not the WECS1 form.

Hospital Vouchers

Please submit to the relevant hospital finance team who will forward to NWSSP for payment.
